

RESOLUTION NO. 1828

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NEVADA, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING PAYMENT TO MID AMERICA FIRE APPARATUS, INC, ROGERSVILLE, MISSOURI, FOR THE EMERGENCY REPAIR OF LADDER TRUCK 216

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 26, Section 26-18 of the City Code, this repair is considered an emergency purchase, allowing the City Manager or his designee to expedite repairs; and

WHEREAS, the City received an insurance payout of \$36,518.70 for the damage to the truck; and


WHEREAS, the total repair cost exceeded the insurance proceeds, with final expenses totaling \$45,998.99, leaving an additional cost of \$9,480.29



Subject: Repair for Ladder Truck 216

Department: Fire Department

Chapter 26 section 26-18 Procurement in exceptional emergency or extraordinary circumstances. Gives the City Manager purchasing authority over \$5,000 if the purchase is a public necessity, health or safety.

Department Notes:

- Repairs were needed on the 2001 Pierce Ladder Truck to replace the damaged ladder waterway, alternator, 20 circuit breakers, air conditioning lines and numerous other maintenance issues which totaled more than the \$5,000 purchase authority under section 26-9 of the Municipal Code.
- On May 25, 2024 Nevada Firefighters were operating the ladder truck at a house fire. When all fireground operations were done, the ladder was being put up and the ladder waterway was damaged, putting the truck out of service.
- Nevada Fire received an insurance check for the truck damages in the amount of \$36,518.70. Once the truck arrived at the repair shop, they found numerous other maintenance issues. Those issues had to be addressed to keep the truck operational. The total repair cost exceeded the insurance proceeds, with final expenses totaling \$45,998.99, leaving an additional cost of \$9,480.29.
- Chief McKlentic approached Interim City Manager Stevens and he authorized the repairs.
