Subject: Surplus Property

Department: Administration

The City has certain equipment, vehicles and items which due to its age or state of disrepair can no longer adequately perform the day-to-day operations of the City.

This Resolution declares the listed vehicles as surplus property, and authorizes the City Manager to dispose of them. Once items are sold the proceeds are deposited into the department's fund that made the original purchase.

Manager Notes:

Two Surplus items which need additional consideration:

1. NorAm 65E Turbo Road Grader. Purchased in 2006 for \$176,000. 250 operational hours. Would like to sell outright by bids, not on Purple Wave because they don't allow reserves or another option is Trade in (Value \$90,000) for a Cat 299D3 Skid Steer with 92" Dozer Blade (Est \$90,000)
2. 2005 Freightliner Rescue Truck – Mileage 119,821.
 - a. May consider donation per RSMo. 320.091. Provides civil immunity to any fire department of any political subdivision which donates equipment used to suppress fire to another department if certain conditions are met. Donation would require a separate resolution
 - b. 2021 General Fund includes \$30,000 revenue for the Truck sale. If not sold then 2021 Budget would be affected. Will not sell on Purple Wave because they don't allow reserves

Sec. 26-14. - Sales of surplus, unusable or obsolete personal property; sales of real property; alternate disposition.

- (b) ***Personal property valued at more than \$500.00.*** Surplus, unusable or obsolete personal property, the estimated value of which exceeds \$500.00, **shall be sold by the authority of the city council**, by formal written invitation to bidders, to the highest responsible bidder. The council shall receive sealed bids after such reasonable notice inviting bids as the council deems proper.
- (e) ***Alternate disposition by online auction.*** The city manager may dispose of personal property of the city by contracting with an online auction service provider. Said contracts will be subject to approval by the city council.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NEVADA DECLARING CERTAIN EQUIPMENT, VEHICLES AND ITEMS IN THE CITY'S INVENTORY TO BE SURPLUS PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZING ITS DISPOSAL

All of the items enumerated below are hereby declared surplus and the City Manager is directed to proceed with the removal of these items from City inventories by sale at public auction, sale by sealed bid, trade-in, or by disposal.
