A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NEVADA, MISSOURI APPROVING AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY THE BENEVOLENT PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS 564 FOR A TEMPORARY PERMIT TO SELL INTOXICATING LIQUOR BY THE DRINK FOR CONSUMPTION ON PREMISES WHERE SOLD ON SEPTEMBER 23, 2017.

WHEREAS, the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks 564 submitted an application for a temporary permit to sell intoxicating liquor by the drink at retail for consumption on the premises of 510 North Centennial Boulevard and;

WHEREAS, the applicant has met the requirements set forth in the Municipal Code Chapter 3 Alcoholic Beverages.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Missouri that the application is hereby approved.

The Benevolent Protective Order of Elks 564 submitted an application and fee for a temporary permit to sell intoxicating liquor by the drink on the premises where sold.

The application is for the outdoor premises of 510 North Centennial Blvd. from 11:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 23, 2017 in conjunction with the first annual Low and Slow Barbecue.

The applicant has met all requirements of Chapter 3 Alcoholic Beverages with the following exception. Davis Park and Katy Allen Lake border 510 North Centennial Blvd. Per Municipal Code Sec. 3-26, "No license shall be granted for the sale of intoxicating liquor within 100 feet of any public park, school, church or other building regularly used as a place of religious worship..."
