Subject: Updating the code to reflect the state statute pertaining to liquor licensing

Department: Administration

The Missouri liquor laws have changed by repeal of Chapter 312 which applied to “non-intoxicating” beer. All liquor and beer is now termed “intoxicating” and is controlled by Chapter 311. We are updating our ordinance to reflect the changes of the state statute.

ORDINANCE NO. 7968

A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NEVADA, MISSOURI, AMENDING SECTION 3-26 SUBSECTION (A) (SALES NEAR CHURCHES, SCHOOLS, PARKS, ETC.) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NEVADA, MISSOURI

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEVADA, MISSOURI, THAT:

Section 1. Section 3-26 subsection (a) of the code of the city of Nevada, Missouri is hereby amended to read as follows:

No license shall be issued authorizing the sale of intoxicating liquor, as defined in Chapter 311.RSMo., to be consumed on the premises where it is sold, if part of such building is less than 300 feet from any part of the building of an existing hospital, nursing home, public or parochial school, or church. Such premises shall not be less than 200 feet for a district R-1 to R-3 inclusive and not less than 100 feet of any public grounds or public park.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval.
